MAJOR COLLABORATION FOR INDUSTRY'S TVET TALENT ADVANCEMENT



10 April 2025, The Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC), in collaboration with key strategic partners, successfully hosted the inaugural VISTA i-Plus Engagement Network (VEN) program for the Southern Region at Amari Hotel, Johor Bahru. The Southern region was chosen as the starting point to reflect the importance of talent development at the Pengerang Refinery and Petrochemical Complex (PRPC).

VISTA, which stands for Vocational Institution Sponsorship and Training Assistance, is a long-standing program that has been instrumental in supplying skilled talent to the oil and gas industry for over 30 years. Originally a PETRONAS initiative, the program has now been expanded to become a collaborative industry-wide effort under the VISTA i-Plus model.

The program was attended by stakeholders from PETRONAS, Johor Petroleum Development Corporation Berhad, HRD Corp, CIDB, Malaysia Petroleum Resources Corporation (MPRC), as well as key industry players operating in the southern region such as Shapadu CR Asia, Enproserve, Highbase, MMHE, Newin, and many more.



VISTA i-Plus is a strategic collaboration designed to produce holistic, skilled TVET (Technical and Vocational Education and Training) workers who meet the demands of the oil and gas sector, in line with the National TVET Policy 2030. The initiative is chaired by En. Ruslan Isahudin, Senior Vice President & Group Chief Human Resources Officer of PETRONAS.



In his closing remarks, the President of MOGSC, who also serves as a member of the VISTA Advisory Council, thanked PETRONAS for opening up the VISTA program to the wider industry and making it a joint effort among all stakeholders. He highlighted that PETRONAS has played a vital role in developing and investing in learning institutions to ensure their readiness to train the next generation of skilled talent.



He also urged industry players, especially MOGSC members, to:

1. Participate actively in talent development programs, as the responsibility cannot rest on the shoulders of the EXCO alone.
2. Engage with grassroots communities, particularly students in schools and colleges, to raise awareness and understanding of the importance of the oil and gas industry.
3. View VISTA i-Plus as an industry-led initiative, and make full use of its potential to secure a sustainable and skilled workforce moving forward.

EXPANDING HORIZONS: MOGSC SEEKS COLLABORATION WITH TURKMENISTAN OIL & GAS SECTOR



On 23rd April 2025, the Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC) participated in the Turkmenistan Economic Investment Forum (TEIF 2025) in Kuala Lumpur. The forum focused on strengthening bilateral ties and exploring investment opportunities, particularly in the energy sector.

MOGSC President Ts. Syed Saggaf served as a panelist and highlighted the strengths of Malaysia's Oil and Gas Services and Equipment (OGSE) sector, citing the OGSE Census 2024, which reported nearly 2,900 establishments mostly SMEs with a gross output of RM79.2 billion and over 123,000 workers. MOGSC expressed interest in collaborating with Turkmenistan's oil and gas sector and planned to engage with PETRONAS, already active in the country, to explore further opportunities.

Adding a personal dimension, Ts. Anwarudin, MOGSC Honorary Secretary, reflected on his past experience working in Turkmenistan, describing it as a unique country rich in resources and potential. He shared his journey as a young offshore engineer, traveling and working globally, and emphasized the lifestyle and character-building aspects of the profession.

At the forum, he also addressed the importance of Technology, Talent, and Funding in developing the energy industry, sharing Malaysia's experience in building a resilient and capable OGSE ecosystem offering a model for emerging nations to emulate.

LABOUR DAY 2025: PM JOINS THOUSANDS TO CELEBRATE WORKERS, CALL FOR TVET REFORM



From 28th April to 1st May 2025, together with a sea of tens of thousands of workers and our Prime Minister, YAB Dato' Seri Anwar Ibrahim, we gathered with the shared purpose of celebrating Labour Day with great spirit and advocating for the rights of workers who had always been the backbone of our nation's economy.

There could be no employer without workers, and no nation without their contributions. He had personally worked for 14 years before becoming an entrepreneur. At that point, he continued working this time for his own company alongside fellow workers and colleagues, as they strove to build the company and grow the Oil & Gas industry together through The Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC).



The role of skilled workers was undeniable in the formation, rise, progress, excellence, sustainability, and success of companies, industries, and the nation. This was the message he carried to uplift the role of TVET (Technical and Vocational Education and Training) and skilled workers. TVET had the power to transform lives and elevate the nation to be on par with respected countries around the world.

He believed that it was crucial to facilitate and mainstream the adoption of TVET, while avoiding unnecessary complexities in coordination across multiple ministries and agencies.



Dignified wages were non-negotiable.

- We could not aspire to become a developed nation while some workers were still unable to afford rent, eat properly, or support a family. The issue of urban poor graduates had to be taken seriously.

Equal opportunities for TVET and professional graduates needed to be championed.

- They deserved fair access to career advancement, promotions, and further education.

TVET graduates needed to be aligned with industry demands.

- Outdated processes, procedures, and training modules that no longer met current needs had to be updated swiftly to match evolving times and the modern industrial landscape.



PARTICIPATION IN MYMAHIR BY TALENTCORP FUTURE SKILLS TALENT COUNCIL



On 8th May, The Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC) was invited to participate in the MyMahir initiative, organised by the TalentCorp Future Skills Talent Council.

The objective of the council was to assess the impact of Artificial Intelligence (AI), digitalisation, and the green economy on the Malaysian workforce. It also aimed to identify the necessary skills, training programmes, and strategic pivots required to address these evolving challenges.

Based on the findings of a conducted survey, it was estimated that approximately 3% of roles within the oil and gas sector were highly impacted—particularly those involving rule-based and repetitive tasks that could be automated. The survey also projected an increasing demand for emerging roles such as AI Engineers, Data Engineers, and IoT Engineers in the near future.

MOGSC remained committed to supporting government-led initiatives to address workforce and talent development challenges. The Council consistently prioritised efforts to ensure that future skills requirements were adequately identified and addressed.

PARTICIPATION IN THE H₂ ECONOMY FORUM 2025



The Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC) was invited by Asia Pacific Green Hydrogen (APGH) to participate in the H₂ Economy Forum 2025, held in Kuching from 13 to 14 May 2025.

The forum served as a valuable platform for MOGSC to engage with key stakeholders across the hydrogen value chain, as well as to reconnect with longstanding industry partners and establish new strategic relationships.

Hydrogen (H₂) was identified as a promising growth area for Malaysia, with Sarawak at the forefront of several major initiatives. These included the Autonomous Rapid Transit (ART) system developed in partnership with REMBUS, the H₂ Hub in Bintulu featuring flagship projects such as H₂biscus and H₂ornbill as well as the Lestari Electrolyser Assembly Plant.

While the cost of producing green hydrogen at commercially viable and sustainable levels remained a significant challenge, discussions at the forum highlighted that a combination of technological innovation, conducive business conditions, supportive government policies and incentives, and the development of a robust value chain would be critical to enabling hydrogen's role in the future energy landscape.

MOGSC expressed its commitment to closely monitoring these developments with a view to identifying potential opportunities for its member companies to participate in and contribute to Malaysia's emerging hydrogen economy.

PRESENTATION AT OFFSHORE WELL INTERVENTION ASIA PACIFIC CONFERENCE (OWI APAC) 2025



On 20 May 2025, the Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC) was represented at the Offshore Well Intervention Asia Pacific Conference (OWI APAC) by MOGSC Vice President, Hj Zahris Sham Abu Musa. He delivered a presentation titled “Energy Transition and Its Impact on Malaysia’s Oil & Gas Sector.”

In his address, Hj Zahris highlighted that the National Energy Transition Roadmap (NETR) projected oil and gas to remain dominant, comprising approximately 77% of Malaysia’s energy mix by 2050. However, he cautioned that this projection should not be interpreted as a continuation of the status quo.

He stressed that Oil and Gas Services and Equipment (OGSE) players must not assume a “business as usual” approach in the coming decades. Instead, he urged industry participants to view the energy transition as a strategic opportunity to diversify their portfolios and expand into emerging energy sectors.

By leveraging existing capabilities and transferable skill sets, OGSE companies could position themselves to become more resilient and adaptable in response to shifting market conditions and evolving global energy demands.

BUILDING FUTURES: MOGSC JOINS HANDS WITH SOGWA AT KARNIVAL KERJAYA BINTULU



MOGSC participated in the Karnival Kerjaya Bintulu, held on 23–24 May 2025 at ADTEC Bintulu, Sarawak, organised by the Sarawak Oil and Gas Workers Association (SOGWA). The event connected job seekers with real industry opportunities, and MOGSC supported the initiative by promoting vacancies from its member companies.

Over 100 job opportunities were offered in fields such as engineering, sales, and digital marketing. The event drew strong interest from fresh graduates, TVET students, and experienced professionals.

INSIDE MALAYSIA'S R&D POWERHOUSE: MIMOS



On 23rd May 2025, the MOGSC Innovation Working Group (IWG) and Energy Transition and ESG (ETESG) had the privilege of being hosted by MIMOS, Malaysia's national applied R&D centre under MOSTI.

As the nation's strategic innovation driver, MIMOS is home to cutting-edge lab services and breakthrough technology platforms that power Malaysia's tech ecosystem. While long known for its expertise in the electrical and electronics (E&E) sector, MIMOS has since evolved, expanding its reach to support a wide range of industries, including oil and gas.

The session kicked off with a comprehensive briefing on MIMOS' growing capabilities, which now span renewable energy solutions, energy efficiency innovations, and advanced AI training programmes. The committee was also introduced to their specialised failure and materials analysis laboratory, an asset of particular relevance to MOGSC members. This facility provides critical testing and diagnostics, including non-destructive evaluation and failure investigation services, useful across semiconductor, mechanical, and materials engineering sectors.



To top it off, the IWG team was treated to an exclusive lab tour, witnessing first-hand the sophisticated, state-of-the-art equipment that makes MIMOS a standout not only in the region's tech scene but also as a partner for industrial transformation.

It was a power-packed session that left a lasting impression, reaffirming MIMOS as a strategic ally in Malaysia's oil and gas journey and a resource for OGSE players seeking local solutions with global standards.

MOGSC STAKEHOLDER ENGAGEMENTS IN JAKARTA IN CONJUNCTION WITH IPA 2025



In conjunction with the Indonesia Petroleum Association (IPA) Convention and Exhibition 2025, the Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC) organised two stakeholder engagement sessions in Jakarta from 20 to 22 May 2025. These sessions were aimed at strengthening strategic collaboration and identifying opportunities for Malaysian Oil and Gas Services and Equipment (OGSE) companies in the Indonesian market. MOGSC led three of the four Malaysian exhibitors at the event: Protankgrüp, MR Technology Sdn Bhd, Trisystems, and GOFORTH Corporation Sdn Bhd.

On the morning of 21 May, the delegation met with the Malaysian Ambassador to Indonesia, His Excellency Dato' Syed Md Hasrin Tengku Hussin, at the Malaysian Embassy complex in Kuningan, Jakarta. The session was also attended by Mr Hafidz Shukri Junit from MATRADE and Mr Ahmad Akmal Muhamad from MITI. The discussion focused on the business landscape in Indonesia, covering regulatory insights, strategic entry points, and support mechanisms available to Malaysian companies operating in the country.



In the afternoon, the delegation visited PETRONAS Carigali Indonesia Operations (PCINO) at their Jakarta office. The meeting was hosted by Mr Yuzaini Yusof, President and Country Head of PCINO. Discussions centred around PETRONAS' upstream activities in Indonesia, which currently include five operating blocks and six non-operating blocks—making Indonesia PETRONAS' most active overseas venture. Mr Yuzaini also shared insights into the Indonesian government's renewed focus on boosting hydrocarbon production under the administration of President Prabowo, including planned regulatory reforms and initiatives to attract foreign direct investment. He encouraged MOGSC members to explore deeper engagement in the Indonesian oil and gas sector.

The visit concluded with a friendly golf match hosted at the Imperial Golf Klub in Karawaci, involving representatives from the Malaysian Embassy, PCINO, MOGSC, and the participating Malaysian companies.

KARNIVAL JOM MASUK TVET



On 12th June 2025, MOGSC Hon. Secretary Ts. Haji Anwarudin Saidu Mohamed was invited to contribute via a public broadcast to elevate the understanding of the Oil & Gas Industry on behalf of The Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC). It also provided an opportunity to address some of the misunderstandings and myths associated with the industry, particularly in relation to the Energy Transition.

He began his journey 25 years ago as a student in an Oil & Gas program at Universiti Teknologi PETRONAS. At that time, a visiting professor predicted that the industry had 25 years remaining based on recoverable reserves. Now, 25 years later, Malaysia had yet to reach peak oil or gas production in fact, the country was producing at record levels.

While predictions and analytics served as useful tools, no one possessed a crystal ball. Only the Creator could truly unveil life's mysteries.

Nevertheless, as professionals, the fundamentals remained the key measures:



- Oil & Gas was not only an energy provider but also supplied molecules that constituted nearly 80% of the products people saw, touched, and used daily.
- Malaysia and Asia had their own context for thriving through a just transition. In Malaysia, the Oil & Gas industry had been central to nation-building, contributing over 40% of government revenue and 20% of GDP in 2023.
- Industry had remained the backbone, while the OGSE sector (comprising approximately 2,000 companies) served as the heart, ensuring essential continuity and progress. Around 160,000 talents acted as the blood cells, providing vital resources for the industry to continue functioning as the engine of prosperity.
- TVET skills and talent had become vital to the industry. Malaysia had established itself as a regional leader in Oil & Gas, no longer a follower, with PETRONAS listed among the Fortune 500 companies. The nation ranked second only to China, thanks to decades of capability building, especially since the 1974 Petroleum Development Act (PDA).
- The TVET agenda remained a priority to address current needs and to prepare the next generation of the workforce to thrive and meet evolving demands, ensuring Malaysia's continued leadership.
- TVET needed to be positioned as a mainstream pathway, not merely a fallback option. Institutions needed to be strengthened, fair wages offered, and careers in TVET recognized similar to the successful models in Japan and Germany. The question remained: was society ready to accept CEOs or leaders emerging from TVET backgrounds without traditional professional degrees?



- The industry continued to offer ample opportunities for TVET graduates. Despite the 2050 net-zero vision, nearly 80% of the energy mix was still projected to come from oil and gas, with renewables largely replacing coal. It was more accurate to describe this as an energy expansion, rather than a transition.

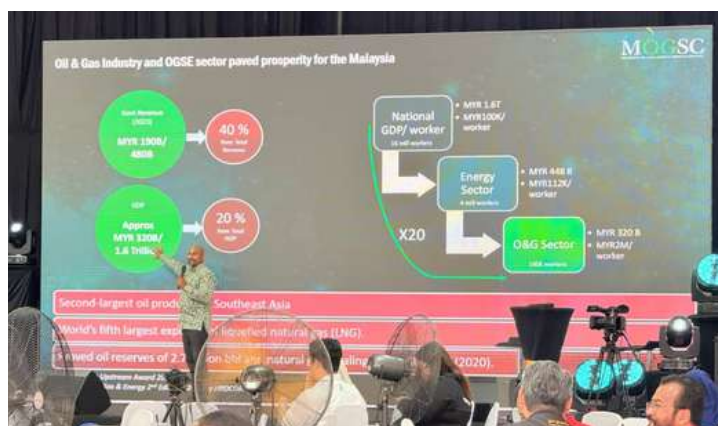
- Amidst complex TVET coordination efforts in Malaysia, every stakeholder had a role to play in empowering the TVET agenda. Recognition was given to the Malaysia Board of Technologists for its efforts in acknowledging blue-collar workers.

VISTA I-PLUS HIGHLIGHTS INDUSTRY-LED TALENT PATHWAYS AT ENERGY ASIA 2025

From 16 to 18 June 2025, Energy Asia 2025 was held at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre, bringing together leaders from industry, government, academia, and civil society under the theme Delivering Asia's Energy Transition. As a premier regional platform, the event served as a catalyst for meaningful dialogue, collaboration, and innovation as the region works towards a more sustainable energy future. Representing a vital pillar of workforce development in the oil and gas sector, VISTA i-plus was honored to participate in this high-level gathering to highlight its role in equipping talent through industry-led technical and vocational education and training.

Over three days, the VISTA i-plus booth provided a platform for purposeful engagement with more than two thousand unique visitors. A total of 522 feedback entries were collected, reflecting strong interest in how technical and vocational education and training can support Malaysia's energy transition. More importantly, the booth facilitated diverse and meaningful conversations with students, educators, professionals, and policymakers who were eager to explore industry-aligned pathways into the energy sector.

Visitors came from a wide variety of backgrounds, including students and lecturers from technical institutions, professionals representing energy companies and consultancies, Energy Asia delegates, educators from Yayasan PETRONAS' Duta Guru programme, and members of the public. Many young attendees expressed a desire to understand how practical and accredited training could open doors to career opportunities in oil and gas. Teachers from the Duta Guru network showed enthusiasm in championing technical and vocational education as a first-choice career option in their schools. Senior workers exploring opportunities to reskill or upskill, along with professionals from surrounding KLCC offices, engaged in discussions on how TVET can support workforce transformation.

To further enhance engagement, VISTA i-plus introduced a light social media challenge encouraging visitors to post creative content from the booth using official hashtags. Prizes sponsored by programme partners helped to generate excitement, foster participation, and expand visibility across digital platforms.

The VISTA i-plus booth was jointly managed by representatives from key institutions and agencies, including the Malaysian Oil and Gas Services Council (MOGSC), the Human Resource Development Corporation (HRD Corp), the Malaysia Petroleum Resources Corporation (MPRC), PETRONAS, Institut Teknologi Petroleum PETRONAS (INSTEP), and Akademi Binaan Malaysia (ABM). Their collaboration reflected the unity and shared commitment that underpin the VISTA i-plus initiative.



In addition to its exhibition presence, VISTA i-plus was represented at a high-level roundtable convened on the opening day of Energy Asia 2025. The session, jointly organised by PETRONAS and PwC Malaysia, was themed Regional Voices, Local Action: Reimagining Skilled Workers Development. The discussion brought together stakeholders from Malaysia and across the region to examine strategic approaches to developing and retaining skilled talent in the energy sector.

The roundtable included senior representatives from PETRONAS, PwC Malaysia, the Malaysia Petroleum Resources Corporation (MPRC), the Malaysian Oil and Gas Services Council (MOGSC), and other leading organisations within the energy value chain. Participants included representatives from WBCSD, OPITO, Tenaga Nasional Berhad (TNB), International Energy Transition Platform and Energy Institute and others. Conversations centred on Malaysia's urgent need to revitalise its approach to workforce development, drawing from international best practices and identifying mechanisms to enhance industry participation. These included collaborative models, public-private partnerships, and scalable strategies to strengthen workforce readiness.

VISTA i-plus' participation in Energy Asia 2025 reaffirmed its position as a credible and forward-looking initiative that supports workforce transformation aligned with the evolving needs of the oil and gas and energy sectors. By bridging grassroots engagement with policy-level dialogue, VISTA i-plus continues to demonstrate the value of an integrated, responsive, and industry-driven approach to education.



As Energy Asia 2025 concluded, it became increasingly clear that Malaysia's energy transition must be matched by equally transformative efforts in talent development. This transformation must be inclusive, coordinated, and sustained through cross-sector collaboration. VISTA i-plus remains committed to this national agenda by building a strong pipeline of skilled talent and advancing long-term career opportunities within the energy industry.
