INDUSTRY LEADERS GATHER AT MOGSC MEMBERS DAY 2025



Bacho Pulong noted, “The HWU Academy equips Malaysians with technical expertise to lead in emerging opportunities, complementing the national TVET agenda for hands-on, industry-relevant training. This initiative empowers Malaysians to shape the future of the oil and gas industry, reinforcing continuity, consistency, and standardisation in HWU capability development.”

Ts. Anwarudin, Ts. Ikhwan, and Ms. Sharmilee represented MOGSC at the launch, highlighting the council’s support for building national talent and advancing industry capabilities.

The academy will also enhance collaboration between industry and academia through partnerships with leading universities UMS, KKTM, UTM, UTP, UiTM as well as key ministries and MOGSC. These partnerships support student enrolment, programme accreditation, grant access, and attract local and international talent.

MOGSC & SIRIM COLLABORATE ON INDUSTRY TRAINING & GRANTS



On 31 October 2025, MOGSC highlighted SIRIM's latest programmes, grants, and training opportunities to help organisations improve operations, ensure compliance, and stay competitive.

A. Up to RM500,000 Matching Grants from SIRIM for Mid-Tier Manufacturing SMEs

This grant is designed to support the transition from manual operations to IoT-enabled systems, driving productivity, automation, and digital transformation. Companies can also take advantage of the fast-track SKM Level 3 (QA/QC) certification programme, allowing experienced professionals to gain recognised certification in just three (3) days, thereby enhancing organizational quality assurance and control capabilities.

B. Training and Certification for ESG

To support sustainability and global competitiveness, ESG training and certification with MIDA grants help organisations meet international standards and access green financing. CompTIA IT certifications, with grants up to RM8,000, are available for eligible Bumiputera students, lecturers, and IT professionals to develop digital skills and advance their careers.

C. Consultation and Advisory

For organisations with high energy consumption, SIRIM QAS also provides comprehensive advisory, audit, and certification services to support compliance with the upcoming Energy Efficiency and Conservation Act (EECA) 2024 requirements.



NATIONAL OGSE BLUEPRINT FORUM 2025



On 11 November 2025, industry leaders and experts convened at the National OGSE Blueprint Forum 2025 to explore key developments shaping the OGSE sector. MOGSC was honoured to participate in this notable event, which focused on accelerating the energy transition, promoting sustainable industry growth, and navigating the evolving policy landscape under the National Climate Change Act.



The forum revisited the OGSE Blueprint 2021–2030, tracing its journey from inception through the recent mid-term review, and reviewing long-term targets up to 2030. The Blueprint provides a strategic framework to ensure the OGSE sector remains competitive, efficient, and relevant, while highlighting its critical role in Malaysia’s nation-building agenda and the pursuit of net-zero carbon emissions by 2050.

A highlight of the forum was the industry dialogue “Safeguarding OGSE of the Future” by Dato’ Ir. Bacho Piong, who emphasised the rapid pace of global change. He noted a shift from the old paradigm of “*knowledge is power*” to “*power is knowledge*,” highlighting the growing role of energy in powering data centres and driving innovations such as artificial intelligence, which are key to the sector’s future.

The OGSE Blueprint 2021–2030 guides Malaysia’s Oil, Gas & Energy Services sector to remain competitive, efficient, and relevant. It promotes innovation, digitalisation, and energy transition while supporting national growth, job creation, and technological advancement. The Blueprint aligns the industry with sustainability goals, particularly Malaysia’s net-zero carbon emissions by 2050, ensuring a resilient, future-ready OGSE ecosystem that contributes meaningfully to the nation’s economic and environmental objectives.

MPRC ENGAGEMENT SERIES - INDONESIA



On 13 November 2025, the Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC) participated in the Malaysia Petroleum Resources Corporation (MPRC) Engagement Series held in Jakarta, Indonesia, marking the inaugural edition of this programme outside Malaysia and underscoring MOGSC's commitment to regional collaboration and international industry engagement.



The programme focused on creating opportunities for Malaysian OGSE companies to expand internationally, featuring pre-screened firms with proven technology and strong growth potential.

Insights from MOGSC members, Velesto and Solar Alert highlighted the significant prospects in Indonesia for companies providing niche products and specialised services, reinforcing the potential for Malaysian expertise to make an impact abroad.

INDUSTRY VISIT TO UNIVERSITI MALAYA RESEARCH CENTRE



On 19 November 2025, happened Industry visit to UM Research Centre organized by MOGSC and Makerspace@UM. The visit was attended by MPRC together with several industry players. The event was graced by the presence of the Former Vice-Chancellor of UM, Prof. Dato' Mohd Hamdi Abd Shukor, and the Dean of the Faculty of Engineering, Prof. Nik Nazri Nik Ghazali.



The visit sparked strong interest, especially during research and product presentations. A highlight was Derialah, an air and water quality monitoring solution by Dr. Mohd Shahrul Mohd Nadzir, Malaysia's Best Research Scientist, which drew attention from companies seeking collaboration.



The session highlighted collaboration opportunities, including SME support, research commercialisation, and advancing technology readiness. Participants valued industry engagement, prompting follow-up discussions between UM research centres (UMPEDAC, CAM, AMMP) and industry partners, with several joint initiatives now underway.

Moving forward, feedback from the session is being consolidated, and a structured roadmap will be developed to further strengthen industry-academia collaboration, with updates to be shared in due course.

DISCUSSION ON THE PROTÉGÉ-RTW PROGRAM (KUSKOP X MOGSC)

On 20 November 2025, at KUSKOP, MOGSC met with the Ministry of Entrepreneur Development and Cooperatives to obtain information on the Protégé-RTW Program

The Protégé Program, organized by KUSKOP, is designed to mentor and support entrepreneurs, SMEs, and industry participants by providing professional guidance, skills development, and business growth opportunities. Through mentorship, targeted training, and access to industry networks, the program aims to enhance participants' capabilities, prepare them for larger projects or contracts, and foster sustainable growth and competitiveness across key sectors, including the oil, gas, and energy services industry.

MOGSC is currently strengthening close collaboration with KUSKOP to promote training initiatives for youth and graduates, as well as incentives available for SMEs for 2026. Any feedback received will be followed up and disseminated to MOGSC members.

MOGSC PARTICIPATION IN IMPEC 2025





Members also agreed to further strengthen the initiative in future meetings to maximise OGTEEN's impact on the local technology ecosystem. Certificates of Appreciation were presented to Working Group members in recognition of their contributions throughout the year.

CLEAN ENERGY TRANSITION ASIA (CETA) 2025



On 10 December 2025, MOGSC EXCO, Ts. Amir Hisham Albakri, was invited as a speaker at Clean Energy Transition Asia, held at the Kuala Lumpur Convention Centre. He participated in the high-level opening panel, which brought together senior leaders from international energy majors, national oil and gas companies, regional utilities, and renewable energy developers.

The panel discussed how a collaborative bridge strategy combining gas, LNG, and renewable energy can accelerate ASEAN's journey towards net-zero emissions, while ensuring energy security and system stability.

Panellists also highlighted the importance of policy and market design in providing incentives for flexible assets and demand-side measures, recognising that market behaviour and investment decisions require time to evolve.

MOGSC 200TH EXCO MEETING & FAREWELL GATHERING




On 16 December 2025, The Malaysian Oil, Gas & Energy Services Council (MOGSC) convened its 200th Exco Meeting, which was held alongside a farewell appreciation for Mr. Khairul Nizam Mohd Aris, MOGSC's Finance personnel, in recognition of his 10 years of dedicated service to the Council. The meeting took place at Amverton Cove Golf & Island Resort.

The occasion marked a significant milestone since MOGSC's establishment in 2003, commemorating over 22 years of service as the voice and advocate of Malaysia's oil and gas industry. Over more than two (2) decades, MOGSC has played a pivotal role in uniting industry players, engaging policymakers, and driving initiatives that enhance industry resilience, competitiveness, and sustainability. The Council's continued advocacy has been instrumental in shaping an ecosystem that supports local OGSE players, promotes capability development, and ensures the industry remains relevant and future-ready amid an evolving energy landscape.



PRESIDENT'S END OF YEAR MESSAGE



As the year draws to a close, we once again find ourselves reflecting on how quickly time has passed, while simultaneously preparing year-end reports and planning for the year ahead.

MOGSC, 2025 began on a strong and optimistic note, with multiple contracts projected to be worth over RM 30b awarded to more than 30 local players at the end of the previous year.

This positive start set an encouraging tone for the year, signalling further opportunities and contract awards to come.

However, as we move forward, the operating environment has become increasingly uncertain. Prolonged geopolitical tensions have continued to fuel volatility in global oil and gas prices. Compounding this uncertainty are ongoing global trade and tariff issues, including those involving the United States, which have introduced further unpredictability into international markets. Closer to home, unresolved issues between the Federal Government and the states of Sabah and Sarawak continue to weigh on industry confidence. And finally, the rightsizing exercise undertaken by PETRONAS, while a necessary and rational step to ensure the long-term sustainability of the national oil company, has inevitably placed the industry under heightened public and stakeholder scrutiny.

Collectively, these global and domestic challenges underscore the need for greater policy clarity, constructive stakeholder engagement, and resilient industry frameworks to ensure that Malaysia's oil and gas sector remains competitive, investable, and sustainable in an increasingly complex operating landscape.

MOGSC believes that, to the best of our ability, we have played our role, particularly through the four key focus areas introduced in 2022. On liquidity, we are encouraged to see capital gradually flowing back into the market, providing much-needed relief to industry players. In parallel, sustained and constructive dialogue with key stakeholders has led to more equitable contracting practices, helping to restore balance and improve commercial sustainability across the OGSE ecosystem. We have also intensified efforts to strengthen local capabilities, enabling Malaysian companies to explore opportunities beyond domestic waters and position themselves for internationalisation. At the same time, MOGSC has worked closely with industry players to promote ESG adoption, while opening pathways for participation in the energy transition agenda, including decarbonisation-related opportunities.

While these efforts have delivered clear progress, we recognise that the work is far from complete. MOGSC remains committed to doing more, working closely with all stakeholders to strengthen industry resilience, competitiveness, and long-term sustainability.

Moving forward to 2026, the outlook for the OGSE sector remains constructive, supported by sustained upstream and midstream activities as well as the national priority to ensure long-term energy security. While investment decisions are expected to remain disciplined amid global uncertainties, activity levels will be underpinned by PETRONAS' commitment to maintaining production at around 2 million barrels of oil equivalent per day. This will continue to drive demand for both capital expenditure programs to develop new fields and brownfield projects, as well as operating expenditure to enhance reliability, efficiency and asset life extension across existing facilities.

PRESIDENT'S END OF YEAR MESSAGE

At the same time, the Malaysian OGSE landscape is undergoing a structural shift, with new growth segments increasingly complementing traditional service offerings. Decarbonisation-related activities are expected to play a more prominent role, particularly in areas such as methane management, carbon capture and storage (CCS), energy efficiency solutions, and digital technologies to improve asset performance and emissions transparency. These emerging segments not only support PETRONAS' net-zero ambitions but also create opportunities for local OGSE players to move up the value chain, build new capabilities and enhance their regional competitiveness.

However, we must remain cautious, as there are several fundamental issues that will inevitably impact the sustainability of the ecosystem.

For local OGSE players, trade agreements such as the CPTPP, which is expected to come into effect by 2027, present legitimate concerns, particularly given the limited clarity at this stage on its detailed implementation and full implications for the domestic supply chain. While there is a strong desire to protect and nurture local industry players, increased market openness is largely inevitable. As such, proactive and targeted measures must be undertaken to ensure Malaysian OGSE companies remain resilient and competitive. This includes strengthening capabilities, improving cost and productivity performance, enhancing technology adoption, and enabling strategic partnerships so that local players are not only protected, but are also positioned to compete effectively in a more liberalised and competitive environment.


Ongoing uncertainties between the Federal Government and the states of Sabah and Sarawak continue to weigh on the broader progress of the industry, affecting investment confidence and long-term planning. It is therefore hoped that these issues can be resolved amicably through constructive engagement and alignment of interests, enabling all stakeholders to shift their focus towards unlocking growth opportunities, accelerating project execution, and advancing the sustainable development of the industry for the benefit of the nation.

The oil and gas industry has undergone multiple cycles of uncertainty in the past, underscoring the need for industry players and stakeholders to work collectively to build long-term resilience. Historically, during periods of oil price downturns, cost pressures have disproportionately fallen on OGSE players, often becoming a significant burden on the sustainability and competitiveness of the sector. In navigating future cycles, it is critical to avoid business models and offerings that are overly burdened by prolonged low-cost pressures. An equitable and balanced contracting mechanism is therefore essential to ensure the competitiveness and sustainability of the sector, while preventing value erosion and cost-driven practices that ultimately prove detrimental to the industry as a whole.


